


The CMC-Global ISO 20700:2017 Self-Declaration Checklist for Consulting Projects

What is the ISO 20700:2017 Self-Declaration Checklist?

The CMC-Global ISO 20700:2017 Self-Declaration Checklist provides a value-added service offering for management consultants who undergo training in ISO 20700, where they will be authorized and recognized as able to self-declare their projects with their clients to be ISO 20700 compliant by an independently recognized authority.

1 Contracting

The purpose of the contracting phase is described in the ISO 20700 as follows: to build and reach an agreement between the MSCP and the client on the services to be provided.

What is the Aim of the Checklist?

The **Aim of the Project Self-Declaration Checklist** is to form a guide for the Consultant and Client to work through Policies and the three fundamental steps of the project (Contracting, Execution, Closure) to ensure that all required points are covered in an agreement with each other.

Why Should I Use the Checklist?

As CMC-Global states, the benefits of **using the Project Self-Declaration Checklist** are that it:

- enables ISO 20700:2017 to be actionable
- enables ISO 20700:2017 to be used as a checklist
- ensures that you are covering the full extent of the Standard
- can be adapted to suit all aspects of different types and sizes of projects regardless of duration, cost, impact, client relationship etc.
- can be easily adapted to suit other project factors including:
 - a standard or customized/bespoke offering
 - local or cross border project
 - government or corporate project
 - industry or sector specific
 - and many others.

What Does the Checklist Include?

The **Project Self-Declaration Checklist** includes the full requirements and all elements of the Standard. These can then be individually tailored and agreed between client and consultant for each project.

They will vary typically based on the type of project and on factors such as the size of the project, duration, cost, impact, client relationship; whether the project is standard or a customized offering, local or cross border, government or privately funded, industry specific or applicable across industry sectors etc.

An example of **Policies and Regulatory Framework** included in the Guidelines and how these can be adapted is shown below:

4.4 Policies

Policies as written in [4.4.1](#) to [4.4.12](#) are to guide the MCSP in the delivery of the assignment and apply during the assignment.

4.4.1 Regulatory framework

The MCSP should maintain an appropriate level of awareness of the relevant laws, policies, rules, regulations and standards that govern their services and those of the client.

The MCSP should:

- engage in dialogue with the client to determine the relevant laws and regulations for the assignment;
- manage any conflict between laws and regulations relevant to its general activities and those relevant to the specific assignment.

If conflicts exist, to ensure clarity the relevant laws and regulations for the assignment should be identified in the agreement.

NOTE In case of multiple jurisdictions, the aim of this subclause is to select and specify which laws are relevant to the assignment depending where the MCSP operates and where the recipient operates. This also creates awareness of potential conflict between laws for cross border assignments.

An example of the **Self-Declaration Checklist** dealing with the **Regulatory Framework**:
